

Quick Start Guide

August 10.2" Digital & Analogue LCD TV (DA102A)

1. It is suggested that you use a roof top aerial when scanning TV channels for the first time, if any signal can be detected, the channel information will be saved on the TV, you may then swap back to the portable antenna supplied and change your location to find the best place to receive the signal.

2. The "TV/AV" button on the TV or remote control is for switching over between 4 modes: "DTV" (Digital TV), "PAL" or "AUTO" or "SECAM" (Analogue TV), "VGA" (VGA input) and "AV" (AV input).

3. Press "TV/AV" to switch to Analogue TV mode and you should see either "AUTO", "PAL" or "SECAM" at the top right corner of the screen. Press "MENU" once to enter the first menu to change "Bright", "Contrast", "Colour" and "Language". Press "MENU" twice to enter the second menu to search channels, change video system (S-COLOR) between AUTO, PAL and SECAM, and change sound system between I (UK), L (France), BG (other European countries) and DK (Russia and Asia countries).

Press ARROW DOWN at the second menu to move to "AUTO-SEARCH", then press ARROW RIGHT to start search for channels.

4. Press "TV/AV" to switch to "DTV" before starting a search for Freeview TV channels, press "MENU" to move to "Main Menu", press ARROW DOWN to move to "Program Search", press ARROW RIGHT to move to "Auto Search", then press "OK" to start the search.

5. If some Freeview channels are missing, repeat step 4 to rescan, when it asks you whether to erase previous TV list, choose "NO", the TV will keep previous TV channels already found and pick up more.

6. To switch off / on subtitles in "DTV" mode:

Press "MENU"

Move down to "System Setting" and press "OK"

Move to "Language" and press "OK"

Move to "DVB Subtitle", press ARROW LEFT to select "OFF" to switch off the subtitle feature, if you wish to turn on the subtitles then select "English" to switch on the subtitle feature.

7. Please note the included portable antenna may only be used in areas where Freeview signal is very strong. There may be difficulties in receiving TV signal with the portable antenna in some regions at present, this is due to the fact that Freeview service (www.freeview.co.uk) is yet to operate in full power in the UK. The government aims to achieve a full switchover by 2012, which will occur in stages, region by region between 2008 and 2012, at present the quality of the Freeview reception varies in different regions across the UK.

As mentioned on Freeview website, only 73% of the UK population are able to receive Freeview at present and only small number of households might be able to use a set top aerial at present. This only applies if you live in an area with coverage close to a transmitter, but reception would still be unreliable and they strongly recommend that you use a roof top aerial for good reception, please refer to: <http://www.freeview.co.uk/help/reception-viewing/q7>

The reception will be improving along with the progress of the Digital Switchover Program. Reception capability may also be affected by various factors such as how close you are to Freeview TV / digital radio transmitters, tall buildings, thick walls, ceilings and weather etc.
